## INDIVIDUALIZED MAJOR PROGRAM – CLAS

### DOUBLE MAJOR WORKSHEET

(applicable to 2004-2005 and later Catalog Years)

**IMJR double major rules apply a little differently than for other CLAS majors because the IMJR is a 36 credit major without “related courses.” Therefore, we look at the overlap between the IMJR and your traditional “field of concentration” (major plus related courses).**

**1. Permissible Overlap in the two Majors.** The minimum number of 48 credits without overlap is required in the two fields of concentration. This means that only four 3-credit courses may be the same in each pool of concentration credits. These may fall within the traditional CLAS major or in its related field courses, or the four courses of overlap may be partly in the traditional CLAS major and partly in its related field courses.

**2. Traditional CLAS Major Related Fields.** The advisor in your traditional major would need to agree that courses from your Individualized Major may count toward your related field requirements.

**3. You may want or need to take more courses!** Remember that four 3-credit courses is the *maximum* permitted overlap. You may wish to have no overlap at all. Or, your Major rules or your advisors may require you to take a particular menu of courses in each Major that has no overlap or less than the maximum permitted overlap.

1. How many credits does your traditional CLAS field of concentration require?
2. If your traditional major advisor agrees, you may be able to use up to 4 classes (12 credits) from your Individualized Major in your traditional CLAS field of concentration. Identify these.
3. Confirm that there are at least 48 credits without overlap in your combined CLAS traditional field of concentration (the major plus the related field courses) and in the Individualized Major. Circle the courses that appear in both the traditional field of concentration and the Individualized Major.
4. How will you satisfy the capstone requirement of the Individualized Major? One way will be to take the capstone course for the Individualized Major (INTD 4600W). Another way will be to write a thesis in the Individualized Major (INTD 4697W). Finally, the IMJR Committee may accept your proposal to meet the requirement with a substitute, either a capstone course or thesis in your traditional CLAS major that would give you scope to explore topics of relevance to both majors.
