## INCLUSION OF EKIN COURSES IN PLANS OF STUDY (applicable to new admissions to the IMJR Program from 9/2004)

The following courses may be taken by **qualifying** IMJRs (see conditions of qualification on the next page), who receive the **permission** of EKIN faculty to take the particular courses:

### Fall

EKIN 202-Theory of Coaching  
EKIN 206-Sport Administration I  
EKIN 271-Sport Law  
EKIN 284- Intro to Sport Management  
EKIN 286-Issues in Sport

### Spring

EKIN 207-Sport Administration II  
EKIN 240-Introduction to Sport and Exercise Psychology  
EKIN 281-Sport Marketing

### Intersession/Summer Only

EKIN 262-Directed Observation and Participation (3 credits)  
EKIN 290-Internship (3-6 credits)  
EKIN 299-Independent Study (3 credit research project)

## Conditions for approval to take the specified EKIN courses:

### GRADES

**General rule.** To be accepted as an Individualized Major with a Statement of Purpose and Plan of Study that includes an EKIN-sport-related focus, a student must normally have a total GPA of 2.7 or better at the time of application to the Individualized Major Program. This rule will be relaxed in two cases:

**Exception 1:** (i) The student's total GPA is greater than or equal to 2.3 at the time of IMJR application AND (ii) the two most recent semester GPAs were each 2.7 or better.

**Exception 2:** (i) A student makes an application to become an Individualized Major in his/her 5<sup>th</sup> semester or earlier AND (ii) the student's total GPA is greater than or equal to 2.5 at time of IMJR application AND (iii) the semester GPA in the semester preceding enrollment in approved EKIN classes is 2.7 or better.

### PROCEDURE

The student must schedule an appointment with the prospective advisor/teaching assistant at least one week prior to the proposal date and must provide in advance via email:

- Unofficial transcript
- Statement of Purpose
- Date that Proposal is required for submission in the Individualized Major Program Office
